Hanover, VA – On Thursday, November 2, 2017, deputies responded to the 7100 block of Autumn Ridge Lane for a reported stolen vehicle. A Toyota van had been stolen from the driveway of the residence. While investigating this incident, the vehicle was located in the Oakley Hill subdivision. This subdivision is located next to Autumn Ridge.

Deputies also responded to another residence in the 7100 block of Autumn Ridge Lane for another stolen vehicle. A 2005 Acura MDX, silver in color, was stolen from the driveway of the residence. At this time, this vehicle has not been located

Also, several **unlocked** vehicles in the Autumn Ridge and Oakley Hill subdivisions were rummaged through; however, no property was stolen.

The Sheriff's Office requests that any citizens with exterior security cameras who live in the area where these crimes were committed, to please check their footage and contact the Sheriff's Office if anything suspicious is noticed. Also, if you were a victim of a larceny from a vehicle please report it to the Sheriff's Office immediately.

The Hanover County Sheriff's Office continues to encourage everyone to **lock** your vehicle(s) and to **remove** all valuables any time your vehicle is unattended. The Sheriff's Office also requests that if suspicious activity is observed, please contact the Hanover County Emergency Communications Center immediately. This is a crime of opportunity.
